



1. What is the Recreation Fee Subsidy Program (RFSP)?

The Recreation Fee Subsidy Program (RFSP) helps people of all ages living in Richmond who are in financial hardship. RFSP participants receive financial support for many registered and drop-in parks, recreation and cultural programs offered by the City of Richmond and Community Associations and Societies.

2. What is financial hardship?

Financial hardship is when a person has trouble paying for basic living costs such as food, clothing, housing, and does not have savings or other financial resources.

3. Who is eligible?

- Richmond residents
- All ages (preschool, children, youth, adults and seniors)
- Individuals who receive government financial assistance and those who do not receive government financial assistance but are in financial hardship

4. Who can submit an application?

- Individuals (19+ years) and families are welcome to apply.
- A family is defined as one or two adults, married or common-law, and their children (legal dependants 18 years and under and 19–24 years if enrolled full-time at a post secondary institution or in an Adult Graduation Diploma program) who live in the same household.
- If multiple families share a household, each family must apply separately.
- If other family members share the household (e.g. aunt or uncle, grandparents, adult children 19+ years not attending full-time post-secondary education or an Adult Graduation Diploma program), each family member or couple must apply separately.

5. I receive government financial assistance – how do I get copies of required documents?

Youth Agreement, Agreements with Young Adults (AYA) or Strengthening Abilities and Journeys of Empowerment (SAJE):

- Contact a Ministry social worker or SAJE staff by phone or in-person to request a referral to the City of Richmond's Recreation Fee Subsidy Program. Phone **604-660-1044** or visit the Ministry of Children and Family Development, Richmond Office at #150-5840 Cedarbridge Way, Richmond BC.

Income Assistance or Disability Assistance:

- Request a *Release of Personal Information* (Form HR0095), including family composition information from the Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction, Richmond Office at #220-7577 Elmbridge Way, Richmond BC. Note: *Confirmation of Assistance* may be accepted for single-person and single-parent households only.

Resettlement Assistance:

- Request a *Confirmation of Permanent Residence* form from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC), Vancouver Office at 1148 Hornby Street, Vancouver BC.

Rental Assistance Program (RAP) or Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters (SAFER):

- Request an approval letter from BC Housing by phone: **604-433-2218** or **1-800-257-7756**.

Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS):

- Request a *Confirmation of Current Status for Guaranteed Income Supplement* (Form CRT-9006) for the period from July 2024 to June 2025 from Service Canada by phone: **1-800-277-9914**.

6. I fall below all financial limits – can I submit my Notice of Assessment, T1 General, T4 Statement, Summary Statement or T5 Statement?

No, the tax documents listed above **cannot** be accept accepted. A *Proof of Income Statement (Option C print)* is required and can be printed from the CRA “My Account” portal at www.canada.ca/my-cra-account or a copy can be obtained by phoning **1-800-267-6999**.

7. What if my family’s net income (line 23600) is slightly above the limit?

The family net income limit is based on the Low Income Measure After-Tax (LIM-AT T1FF) from Statistics Canada. New data is released annually. Visit www.richmond.ca/subsidy for the most up-to-date details.

8. What is “Income from other sources not shown”?

This includes worldwide income and monetary gifts received that have not been declared on a tax return.

9. How long will it take to process my application?

Application processing takes an average of 10 business days if the application is complete with all supporting documentation. Application status will be emailed or mailed to the home address.

10. When can I begin using my new RFSP subsidy?

RFSP 2024–2025 is valid from September 1, 2024 (or from the date of approval) to August 31, 2025 and applies to many registered and drop-in programs. Unused subsidies will expire on August 31, 2025.

11. What drop-in admissions are excluded from the RFSP?

12. What types of registered programs are excluded from the RFSP?

*Licensed child care programs, including Licensed Day Camps and Before/After Care, are eligible for the Provincial Affordable Child Care Benefit. For more information, visit www.gov.bc.ca/affordablechildcarebenefit.

**The City provides subsidized aquatic training courses through the Instructor/Lifeguard Subsidy Program (ILSP) for eligible individuals. Visit www.richmond.ca/lifeguarding for eligibility and application information.

13. Is the maximum subsidy limit for each facility or all facilities in total?

Children and youth (18 years and under) receive a maximum subsidy of \$300 per year and adults and seniors (19+ years) receive \$100 per year for registered programs at all City and Community Partner facilities. **Note:** There are no limits placed on the number of drop-in/registered visits by RFSP participants.

14. Can I transfer my unused subsidy to another family member?

No, unused subsidy amounts cannot be transferred or shared with another family member or friend.

15. Can I apply subsidy towards previous purchases completed before subsidy approval?

No, subsidy is valid from the date of approval and remains active until August 31, 2025. Subsidy will not be retroactively applied to previous purchases. To access subsidy, please submit an application and allow the application to be processed before completing any registrations or payments.

16. Can I apply subsidy towards Fall programs once I am accepted for the upcoming program year?

Yes, once Fall programs are available for registration and applicants have been accepted into the upcoming RFSP year, subsidy may be applied towards upcoming Fall program registration.

17. Can I carry over unused subsidy from one program year to the next?

No, unused subsidy cannot be carried over to the next program year and expires on August 31. However, it is possible to use remaining subsidy in the summer to register for programs that begin in the fall. As subsidy is intended to be used for programs ending within the same program year it was allocated, please be aware that if a participant uses a previous year's subsidy to register for programs that begin on or after September 1 and then withdraws from the class, or if the class is cancelled for any reason on or after September 1, the previous years' subsidy is no longer available via the registration system (i.e. no subsidy credit can be issued).

18. Do I need to reapply each year?

Yes, all applicants need to reapply as financial situations can change over time.

19. How can I submit my application?

Completed applications and supporting documents can be submitted in **1 of 4 ways**:
